Scholarship Overview

The O'Berry Center Foundation provides a \$1,000 scholarship each year to qualified applicants working toward an undergraduate or graduate degree with the intent of serving persons with developmental disabilities (DD). There are two separate scholarship programs:

 O'Berry Center Scholarships: Employees of O'Berry Center or immediate family members of employees are eligible to apply.



 Knights of Columbus / LAMB Foundation Scholarships (KofC): In partnership with the KofC, individuals who are residents of NC are eligible to apply.

Scholarship Guidelines

High School Senior Eligibility Requirements

- Intend to seek an undergraduate degree in a field related to developmental disabilities.
- Intend to work with persons with developmental disabilities after college graduation.
- Already be accepted at an accredited college or university
- Have a high-school grade point average of 2.8 or higher.

<u>Undergraduate or Graduate</u> <u>Eligibility Requirements</u>

- Enrolled full-time as a undergraduate or graduate student.
- Have an undergraduate cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher, or a graduate cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Continue to major in one of the eligible degree programs with the intent to work with persons with DD.
- Demonstrate evidence of volunteer (or paid) experience working with persons with Developmental disabilities or evidence of involvement in research related to persons with DD.

How to Apply

Applications are due by April 1st of each year, and notifications will be made by the 2nd week of May.

Submission Checklist

High-School Senior:

- Completed Application Form
- Two letters of reference, one of which must be from a teacher.
- High-School Transcript

Undergraduate or Graduate Student:

- Completed Application Form
- College Transcript
- Two letters of recommendation from a supervisor from volunteer or paid work experience and / or a profession in the major.

NOTE: O'Berry Center Staff must submit a letter from their supervisor on agency letterhead.
